# **Girls Golf Rocks!**

The project aims are to address the disparity between girls and boys participation in golf and will be delivered in partnership by England Golf; The Golf Foundation; the Cumbria Golf Development Group and the County Ladies Golf Association. All of us will work together to target new girls aged 5-18 in a county wide recruitment drive. Four centres within the county will deliver girls only coaching sessions with emphasis placed on fun, social and friendship aspects of golf rather than just the coaching and playing side of the game. A number of the county junior girls squad members have been recruited as Ambassadors who assume the position of role models to inspire the new girls and support their continued participation during the project. Our Ambassadors will receive leadership training and asked to support the recruitment drive as well as providing feedback on how to drive the programme forward. Delivery of the project will consist of a 7-week programme which includes:

- Taster day run during March/Easter Holidays; 5 weeks of coaching (to be completed within 2 weeks of the taster day and to be completed by May;
- Par 3 fun event where the new girls play with the County Ambassadors in May;
- Discounted membership opportunities are promoted along with follow on coaching in either girls only session or integrated into junior coaching at the centre.

### **County Competitions - Changes to Format**

**Bronze Championship** – The Bronze Championship will now be played on the middle day of the County Championship – this year on Wednesday 31 May at Kendal Golf Club. Previously the Bronze Champion was decided by a Stableford conversion. However, – after consulting all clubs last year – we have agreed that the Bronze Champion will be the player who returns a full medal score on the day – there will also be a separate Stableford prize for any player who decides to pick up on any hole.

Also, in 2018, we are trying to organise a number of our open competitions on a weekend. As with most clubs, entries to open competitions are declining and so to try and attract working ladies and also enabling juniors to support our events, we are liaising with clubs to try and facilitate this. This will be on a trial basis.

## **Squad Coaching 2017**

#### **Mrs Louise Mayne**

It is with great sadness that we have to announce the death of Mrs Louise Mayne – member of Penrith Golf Club.

Louise was a Vice-President; County Secretary for 6 years and soon after finishing as County Secretary she was appointed the Vets Secretary completing 5 years in the role. In more recent years she held the position of Vets President for two years and not only will she be missed in Cumbria but throughout the Northern Counties. Isobel Williams said of Louise that "she was a lovely lady, always gracious and who did everything with a smile. Never one to force her opinion on anyone but rather would offer valuable and truthful advice. She was great encourager who only saw the best in everyone. She was a gentle caring lady, indeed a lady in every sense of the word."

Our two coaching sessions with Alyn Cousins, Professional at Ulverston Golf Club took place on Sunday 12 February/Sunday 12 March. Unfortunately our first session on the range was cut short because of the bitter cold so we moved indoors where Lyn Hill from Silloth GC is working with the squad this year on psychology. We had more success with our second session where the squad were put through a number of short game skills challenges. Alyn is working with the players to get them thinking about what sort of shot to play bearing in mind the potential for severe windy weather at Morecambe GC for match week and to introduce these shots into their games. We also had a workshop with Tim Barry, Head of Department of Medical & Sport Sciences at the University of Cumbria. One of the key points he asked the squad to think about was their post-shot routine (yes post-shot!). Our annual friendly matches are now in full flow which gives us valuable foursomes practice. Next match is on Sunday 9 April against Carlisle Men's Scratch Team followed by our friendly against Northumberland Ladies at Workington GC on 23 April, finishing off with Cumbria Men's Senior Team at Kirkby Lonsdale Golf Club on Monday 1 May.
